This workshop will explore different aspects and examples of Indigenous environmental activism in the 21st century and will provide insights into the ways of integrating issues and struggles for Indigenous self-determination in the EFL-classroom.

### The U.S. Elections 2024

On November 5 of this year, U.S. citizens will go to the polls to elect a President and their members of Congress, and to choose candidates for state and local offices. Many believe that 2024 will be one of our most consequential elections. The national campaigns are likely to center on issues such as the economy, immigration, the overturning of Roe v. Wade and abortion access, foreign affairs including the war in Ukraine and the conflict in Gaza, climate, diversity in the U.S including LGBTQ policies, healthcare and Social Security, issues affecting Generation Z--not to forget former President Trump's legal woes or President Biden's age. This talk will provide insight into the campaigns, public opinion polling, party platforms, and the prospects for governance. The talk will also provide attendees with the tools to understand not only the 2024 elections, but future elections, as well as the dynamics of U.S. politics more generally.
